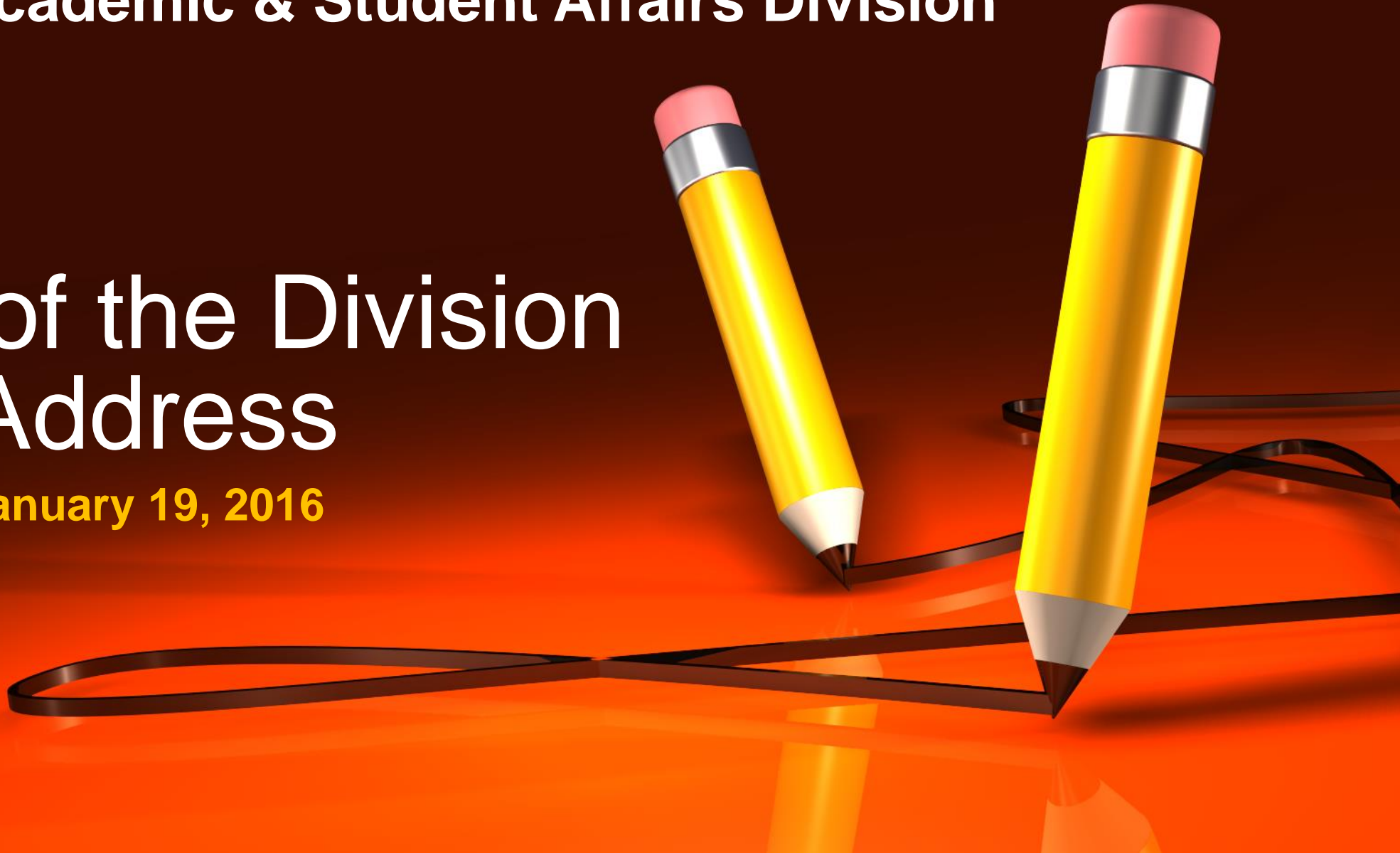

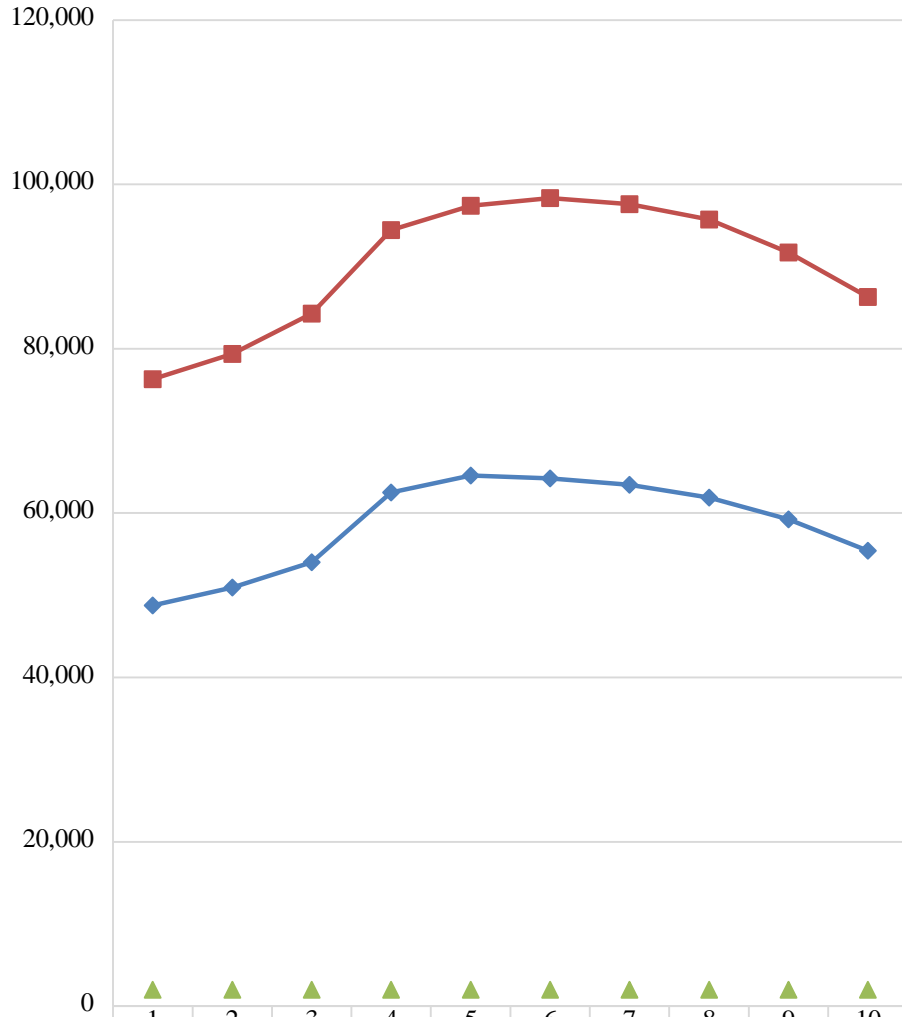

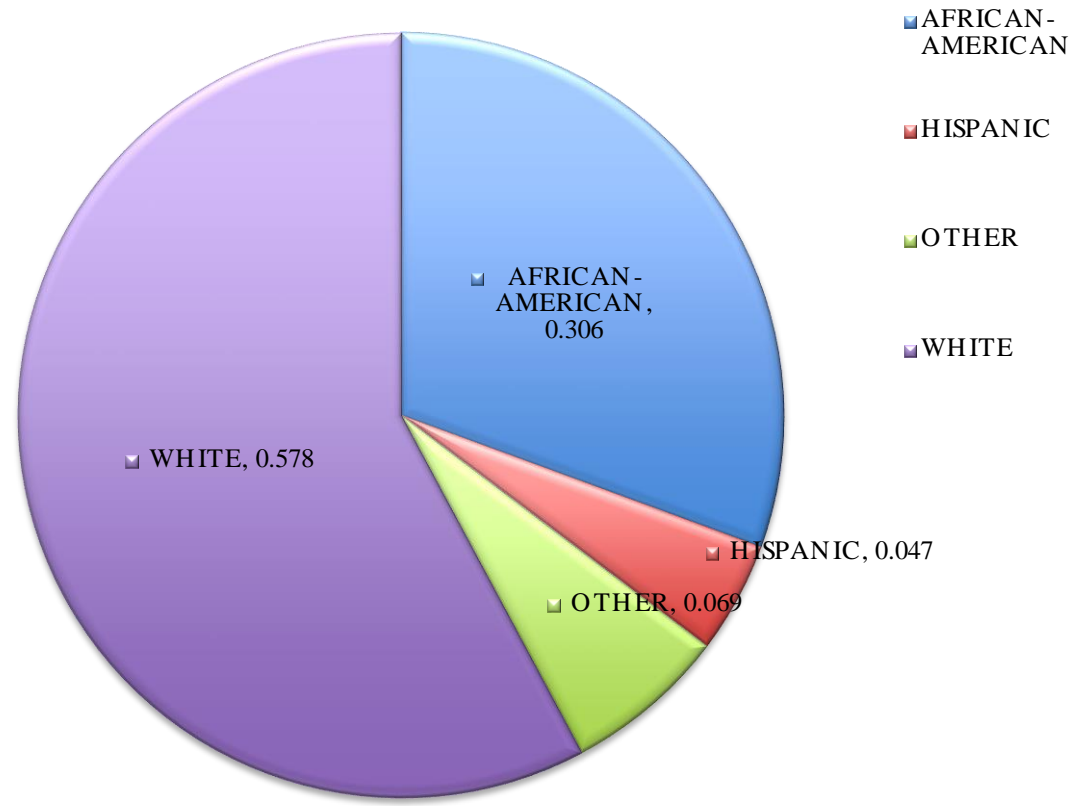

FALL ENROLLMENT AND FTE TRENDS ACROSS 10 YEARS



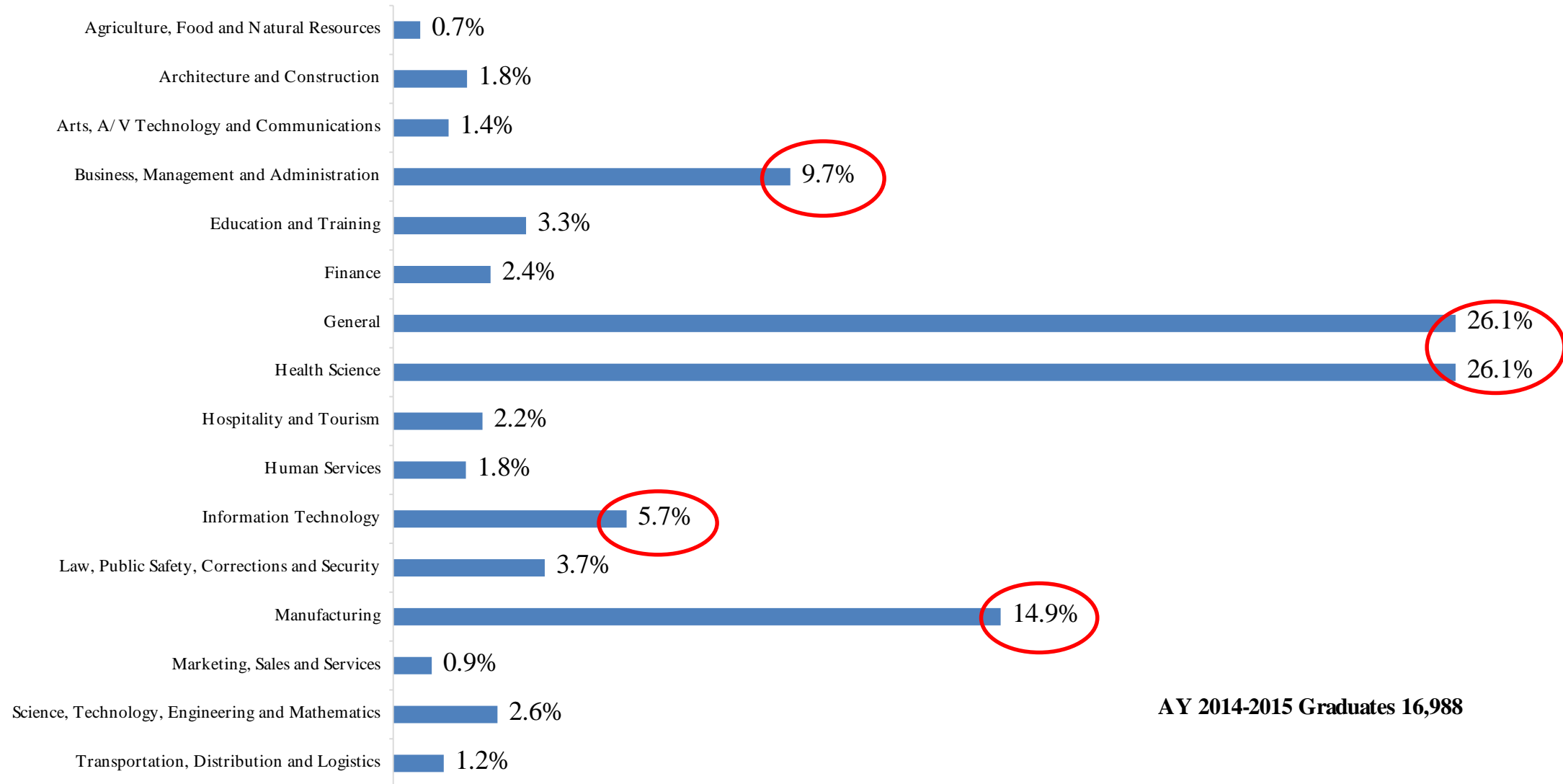

FALL 2015 ENROLLMENT BY RACE/ETHNICITY FOR THE SYSTEM

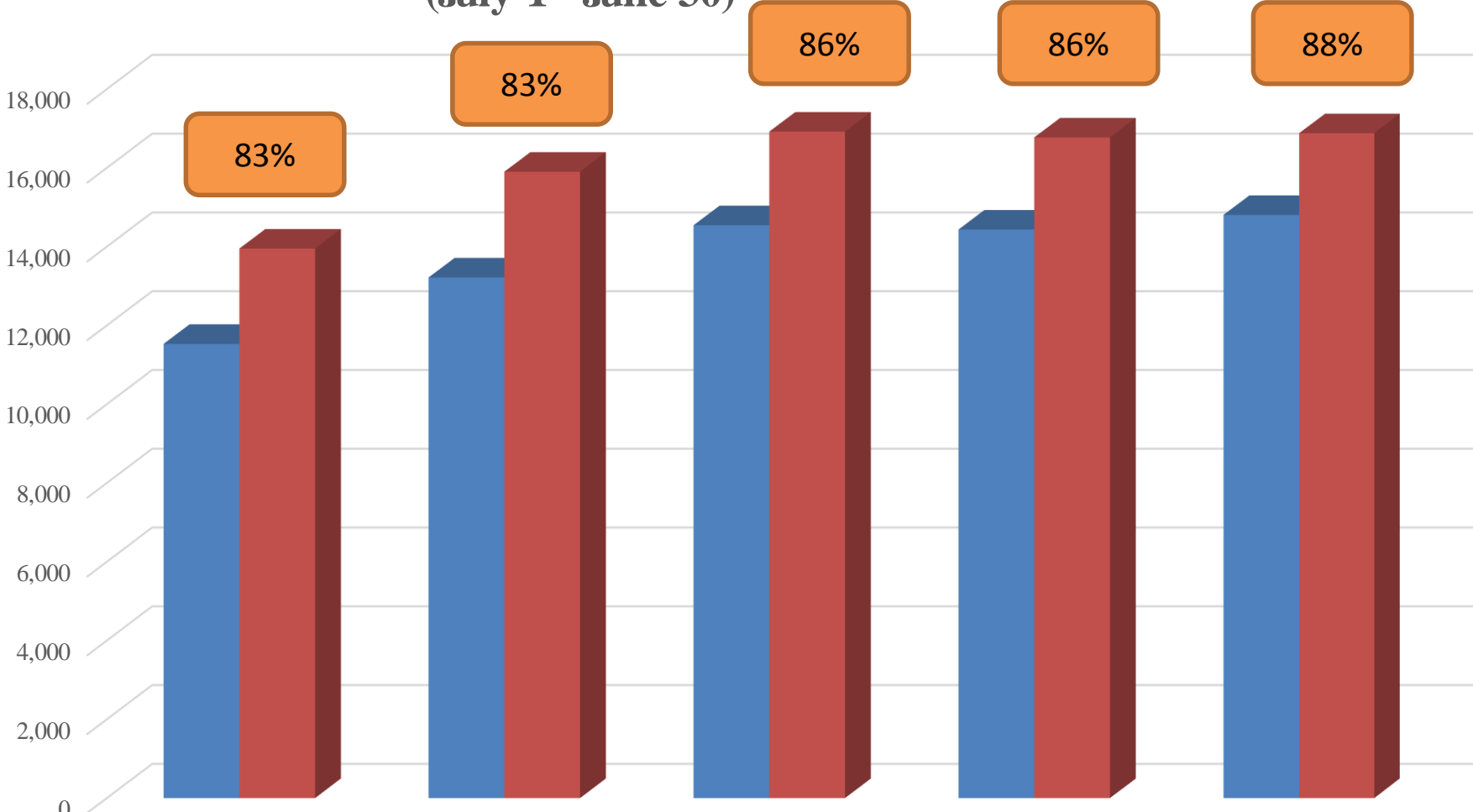

4. Compliance & Reporting

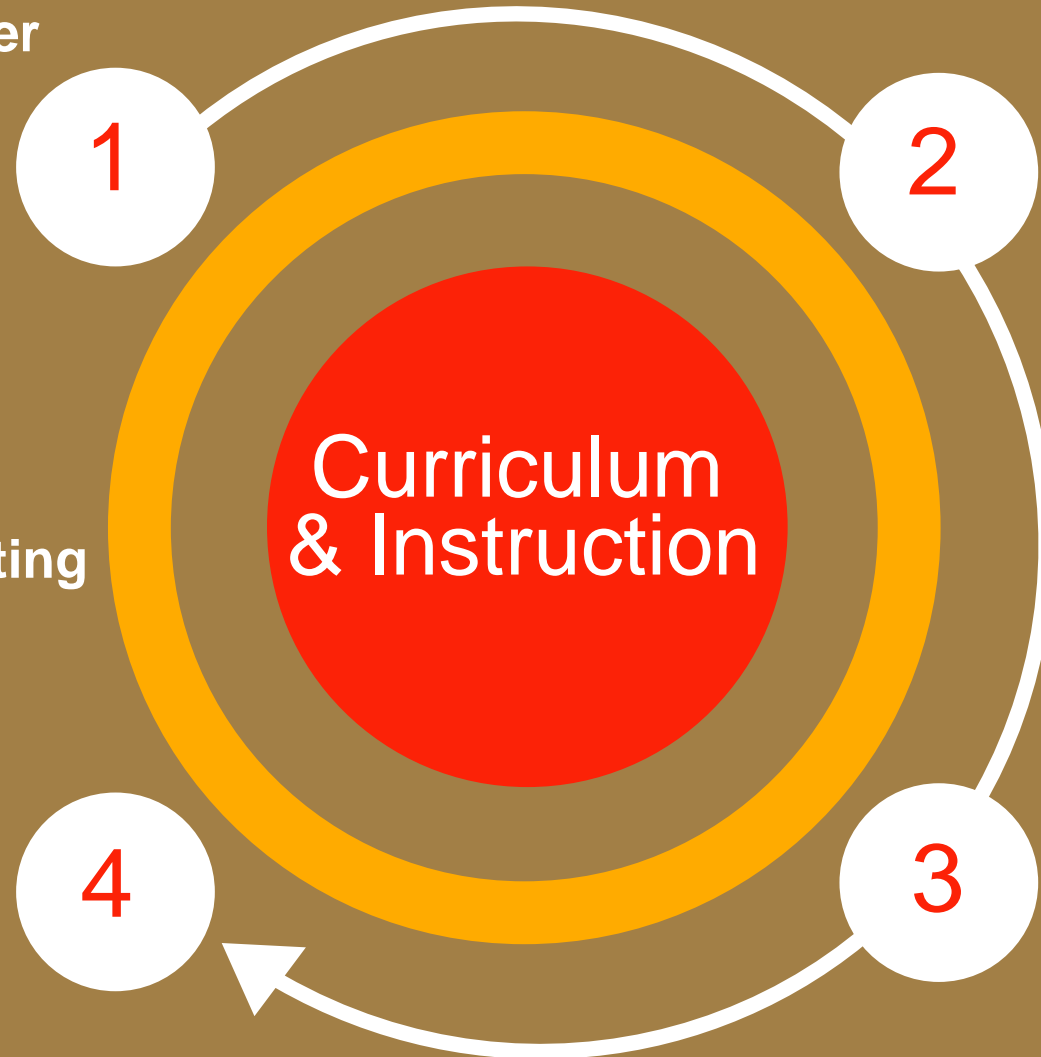
The System Office collected and assessed data for dual enrollment, program evaluation, and Web Accessibility.

2. Curriculum Approval

Curriculum approval and review is ongoing. In 2015, a total of 33 new certificates were approved, in addition to 98 courses, and four associate degrees.

3. Peer Groups

Several peer groups met throughout the year to include Allied Health, Early Childhood, Distance Education, Institutional Effectiveness, Library Directors, and Tutoring. A placement team was also established to discuss the transition from COMPASS.

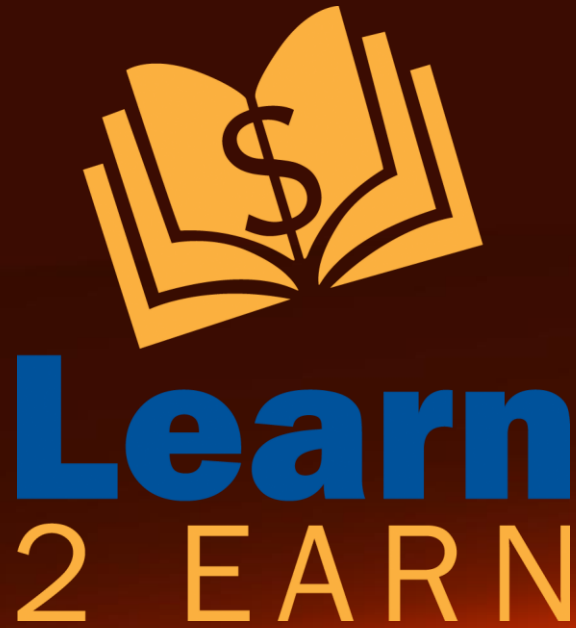

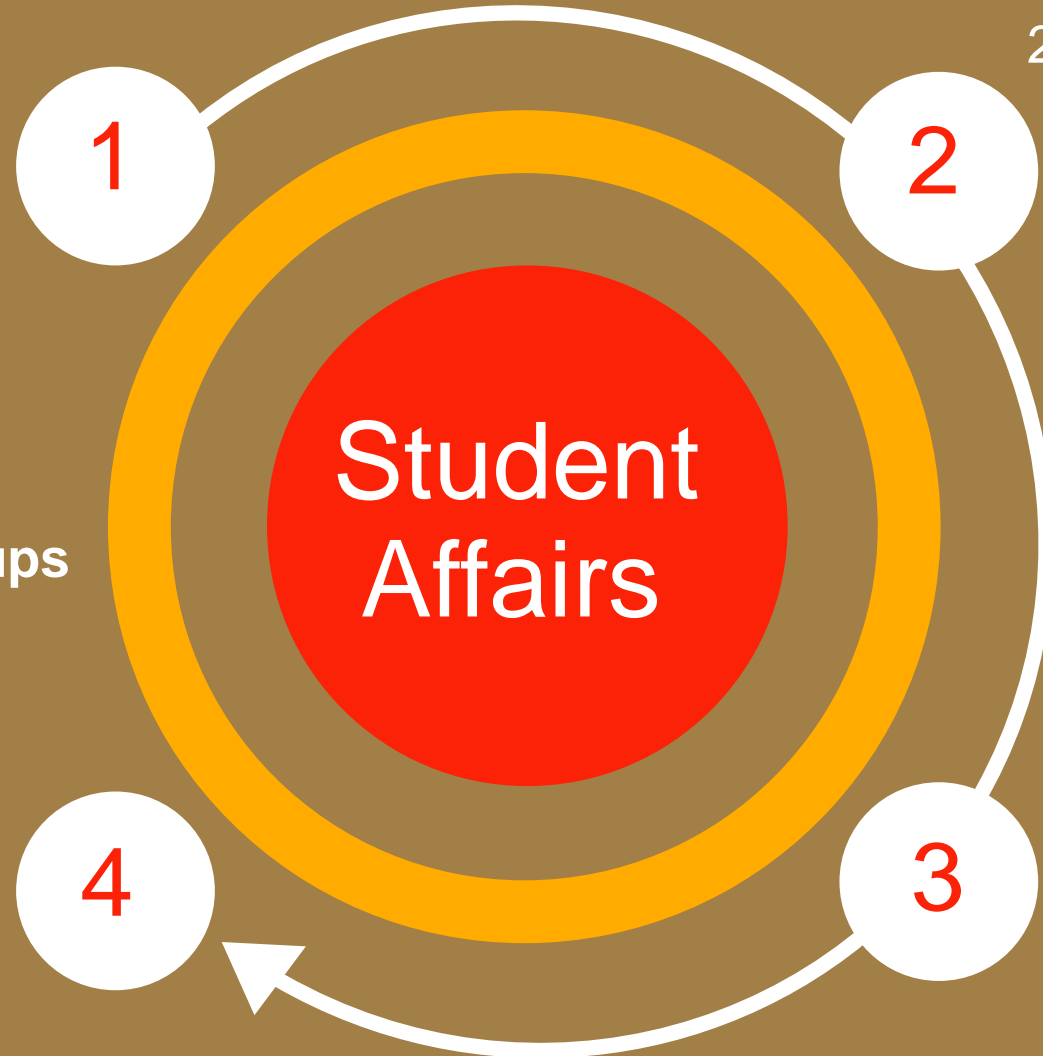


1. Title IX

Two audits were conducted in 2015. The biannual report was also submitted along with the targeting plan.

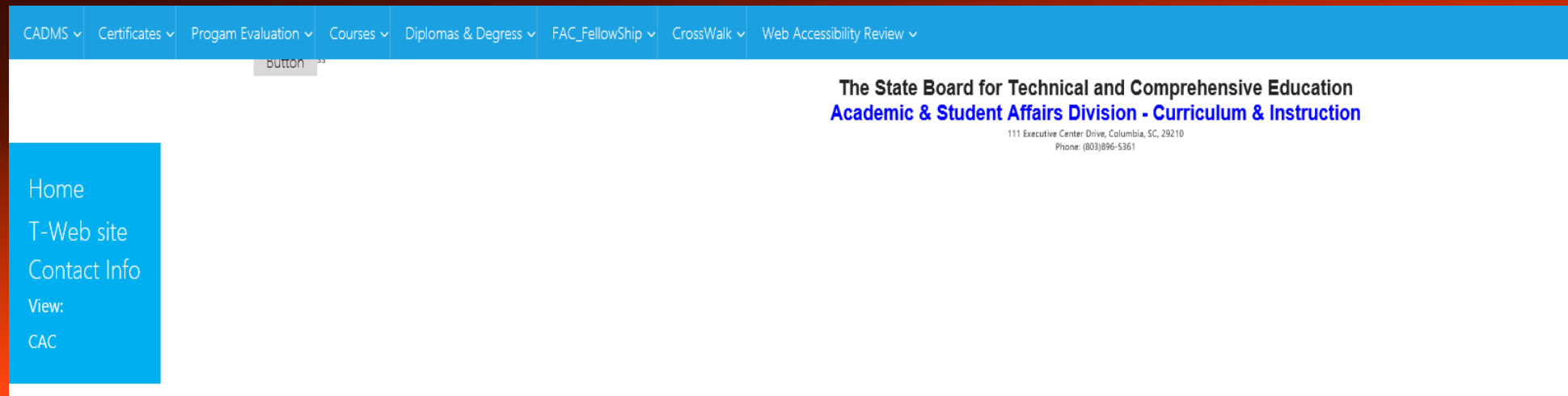

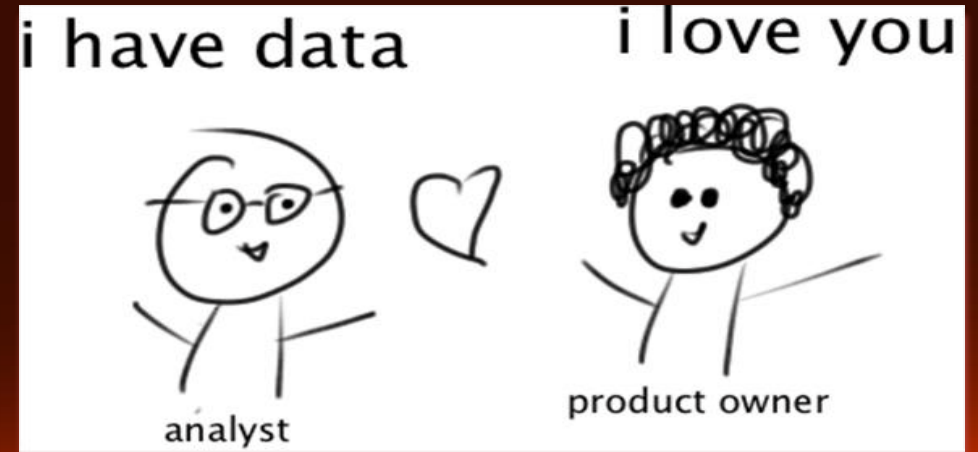

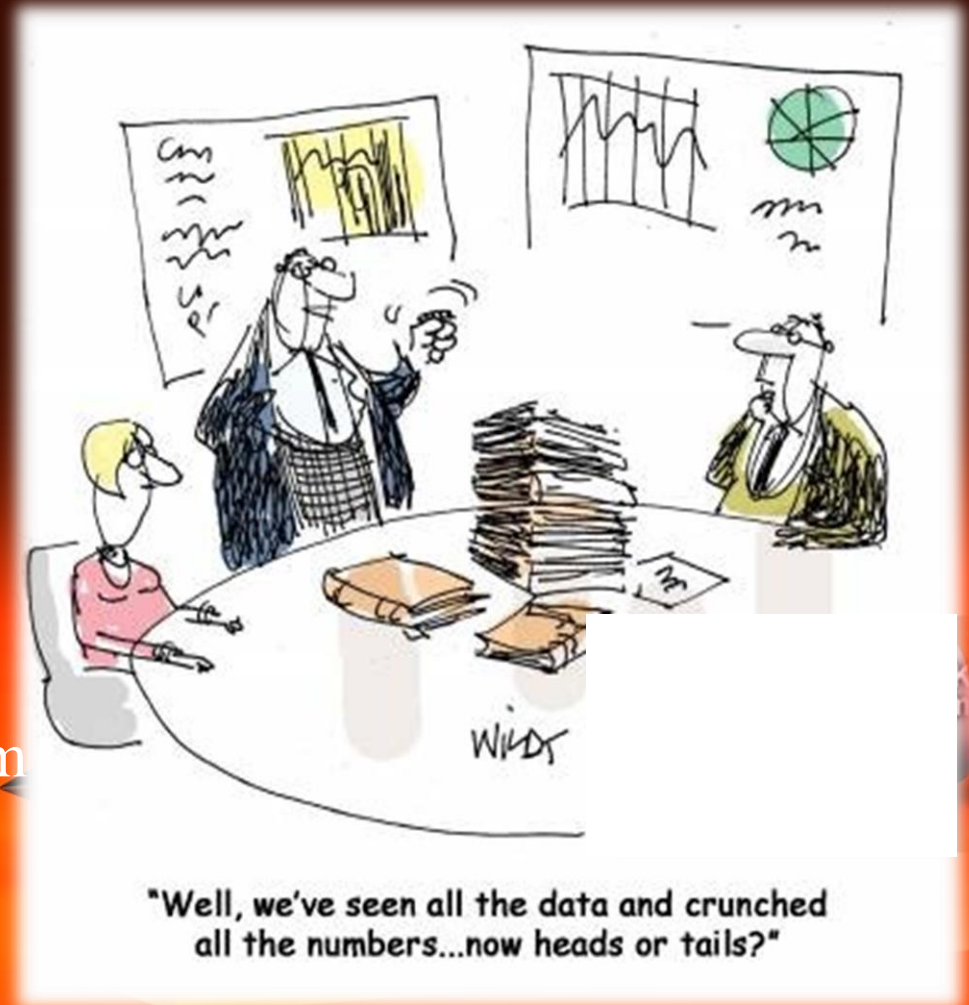
